Behaviour Policy

At Caythorpe Primary School we have high expectations for behaviour for learning and conduct. We believe that positive attitudes and mutual respect between adults and children leads to a harmonious learning environment where everyone feels safe, happy and valued. We recognise the significant impact that positive behaviour can have on children's overall progress and attainment. A set of Whole School Rules, based on our Golden Values, are clearly displayed around school and regularly referred to when reviewing both right and wrong choices made by the children.

School Rules

- Respect** - Always use your manners when talking to others.
- Understanding** - Listen to others and say sorry for your mistakes.
- Honesty** - Always tell the truth.
- Determination** - Keep going even when you find things difficult.
- Friendship** - Be kind and helpful to others.
- Enjoyment** - Look after and use equipment properly so we can enjoy ourselves.
- Teamwork** - We work together to make our school a happy and safe place.
- Pride** - Look after our school and keep it tidy.
- Excellence** - Aim high and always try your best.

All classes adhere to the daily Traffic Light Behaviour System which is clearly displayed in every classroom. Children begin each day on 'Green' and will only be moved if they choose not to display our Golden Values and follow the School Rules. The following system applies throughout the day for both indoor and outdoor activities.
