### More foster carers needed in Lincolnshire

Lincolnshire County Council's Fostering Service is highlighting its campaign to recruit more foster carers for some of the county's most vulnerable children.

In Lincolnshire there is a steady increase in the number of children needing foster homes locally. In particular more foster carers are needed to look after teenagers, children who need to be cared for long-term (also known as Permanent Fostering, which is usually until independence), brothers and sisters who need to be kept together, and children with additional needs.

Applicants are welcomed from all backgrounds regardless of race, religion, sexuality, marital or employment status. So long as you can provide a loving, secure home and have a spare bedroom to meet the needs of the children in your care, your application will be considered.

If you feel that you could offer a secure, understanding and loving home to any of these groups of children, Lincolnshire Fostering Service would love to hear from you.

### Flu Vaccine

The annual flu vaccination is now due for children from Reception up to Year 5.

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

From October this year the school immunisation team will no longer be using paper consent forms.
