## <u>Attendanc</u>e

Good attendance is vital for your child's learning and development. Following statutory guidelines, absences cannot be authorised during term time and may only be granted in the most exceptional circumstances. Please ensure that children come to school promptly every day so that they don't miss out on vital learning time.

## 96% attendance is the minimum target for all children. Every day counts!

The chart below shows the impact of missed days on children's learning

190 days each year

In school for the full 190 days 100% attendance Best chance of success-gets your child off to a flying start

In school 180 days, 10 days of learning missed 95% attendance

10 days missed

19 days missed

In school for 161 days, 29 days of learning missed

29 days missed

85% attendance This is worrying as almost 6 weeks of school missed in one year making it harder for your child to make progress. School Liaison Officer is involved.

In school for 152 days, 38 days of learning missed 80% attendance

38 days missed
