### National Online Safety

#### Top Tips for Parents:

- Be present when your children are online
- Talk regularly to your children about how to keep safe online and the importance of talking to you or another trusted adult if they are worried about anything
- Ensure that you set up parental controls for all devices at home. This will help to restrict the types of content that your child can view, as well as help you to monitor their activity.
- Make sure you talk to your child about how they shouldn't succumb to peer pressure.
- Decipher whether things are real or hoax as not everything you see online is true.
- Report any material that you deem to be inappropriate or harmful as soon as you come across it. You should also block the account/content to prevent your child from viewing it.
- Speak to the safeguarding lead within your child's school should you have any concerns regarding your child's online activity that could affect them.
- Children can contact ChildLine on 0800 1111 if they would like to talk to a trained counsellor about anything that is worrying them.



#### What parents need to know about the MOMO Challenge

According to recent news the "momo challenge" is a hoax. The original tale said a character with bulging eyes would "hack" into WhatsApp and set children dangerous "challenges" such as harming themselves. Charities say there have been no reports of anybody being "hacked" or harming themselves as a result. However the image is now being shared on social media to frighten children. It has been found edited into unofficial copies of children's cartoons such as Peppa Pig on YouTube. Fact-checking website [Snopes](#) suggested the story was "far more hype or hoax than reality", but warned the images could still cause distress to children. Police have suggested that rather than focusing on the specific momo meme, parents could use the opportunity to **educate children about internet safety**, as well as having an open conversation about what children are accessing.
