Safeguarding

Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and to protect them from harm. This involves protecting children from abuse and maltreatment, preventing harm to children's health or development and ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care.

We have been talking about safeguarding in assembly and all the children know that if they have a worry or a concern, they can talk to the School's Designated Safeguarding Leads, who are Miss Turner and Mrs Brockington. This is the same if parents ever have any queries or concerns regarding safeguarding.

This week the Community Inclusive Trust completed a Safeguarding Audit here at school and I am delighted to tell you that they found that we do an excellent job of keeping our children safe. Our visitor was particularly impressed with the way in which the children were clear about the safeguarding procedures that we have in place and commented on what a positive ethos we have across the school.

School Uniform

We are proud of our school uniform and the sense of unity and belonging that it brings. Therefore, we request that all children wear full school uniform, as detailed below:

Navy sweatshirt or cardigan, royal blue polo shirt, grey/black trousers or tailored shorts, skirt, pinafore or blue & white checked summer dress.

Black school shoes and plain socks/tights must be worn all year. We request that sandals and canvas shoes are not worn, to prevent unnecessary playground accidents.

P.E. Kit should include a plain white t-shirt, navy/black sports shorts and a pair of plimsolls or trainers. Jogging bottoms and a warm sweater will be needed for the colder months of the year. P.E. clothes should be kept in a drawstring bag and left in school during term time and sent home for washing during the holidays.

All clothing items, PE bags, lunchboxes, water bottles etc must be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Jewellery

Jewellery presents a health and safety risk during the school day. **As such we request that children do not wear jewellery to school** unless there is a medical reason. Children should only wear stud earrings in their ears. These need to be removed for PE lessons. Teachers are no longer allowed to help children remove or insert earrings, nor are they allowed to put tape over their earrings for PE.

Hair Accessories

If your child has long hair, please ensure that it is tied back neatly with small, school coloured hair accessories for school.
